Greetings Brother and Sister Blue Knights®,

The Blue Knights® is an amazing organization! As the SRC Vice Chairman, I am constantly dealing with chapters throughout our conference with all kinds of issues. The saddest issue I deal with is when a chapter notifies me about a fallen officer. The SRC Executive Board will always make sure that we as an organization do everything we can to support the officer's family.

As most of you know, recently my brother-in-law, Blue Knight® Wayne Sblano, passed from 9/11 related injuries. He retired after 20 years of service. The NYPD recently contacted my family to inform us of several memorial services being held in his honor.

A few weeks ago, my family and I were present at Police Headquarters to attend one of the services. While there I met several officers that I worked with when I was a Detective. I provided them with my contact information and spoke about the Blue Knights®. Of course, I told them if they ever needed anything from us to call me and I would see if I could help.

On October 21, 2018, I received a telephone call from a friend who is assigned to the New York City Police Department's Employee Relations Division. We spoke about a Fallen Hero, NYPD Retired Officer Scott Blackshaw and his love for motorcycles.

We both agreed that a motorcycle presence would be a proper sendoff for this hero. I told him that I would do everything I can to make this happen. Being retired and living out of New York for 12 years, most of my contacts are gone. I started to go through my phone book for NY contacts and members of the Blue Knights® that I know transferred from the tri-state to our conference.

One name immediately jumped off the page, our current State Representative, Jim Trachta. After contacting Jim and explaining the situation to him, he told me that he was meeting with members of the Blue Knights® from NY-X. in New York the following day.

After his meeting with NY-X, Jim contacted me and stated that it was all taken care of, Officer Blackshaw would have some Blue Knights® at his funeral. Jim explained that he spoke with Brother, Vincent Calderon, a Director of NY-X and he would be handling the escort detail. I contacted the NYPD and advised that there should be a few Blue Knights® present and that we would assist the family in anyway we could! The NYPD provided me with a contact number for the family's representative to pass onto NY-X. After checking my Face Book account, I realized that I was friends with Vincent, so I sent him a message thanking him for his assistance.

On the day of the funeral, I contacted the NYPD and spoke with them about the funeral. The Lieutenant was so happy and amazed on how many bikes showed. He filled me in on the entire detail and said that it was overwhelming and couldn't thank the Blue Knight® enough.





From the SRC Int. Rep.



Law Enforcement Motorcycle Club Raises Money for Foster Kids

The local chapter of the Blue Knights held their annual CASA Benefit Ride Saturday afternoon to help support local abused and neglected children.

Starting in 2014, the Blue Knights GA Chapter XVIII began partnering with the Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) program, which provides safe homes for abused or neglected children involved in juvenile court deprivation proceedings, for a fundraising motorcycle ride that raises money for help care for the kids in the program.

CASA advocates are volunteers who fight for the best interests of children involved in court proceedings. These volunteers, unlike paid social workers, work only for the best interests of the children in their cases. They make sure children's needs are met and make they have a safe and stable home.

This year's ride had the largest ever total number of participants with more than a hundred bikes and jeeps riding along. The bikes were escorted from the Elks Lodge on South Davis Road through their traditional route to Pine Mountain and back for the one hour benefit ride.

The group also held their traditional charity auction, where they auctioned off donated items from businesses around Troup County.

All in all, the bikers raised \$2,255 for CASA during the event, which will go directly to helping provide for the children of Troup County that are in foster care. This will be added to the total from their Christmas raffle proceeds where they raffled off a kids four-wheeler, for a total of \$4,200. The Knights expect to present a total check to CASA sometime next week.

The event is an annual tradition for the Blue Knights and has grown each year and they plan on riding again next spring.

The Blue Knights are a non-profit fraternal organization consisting of active and retired law enforcement officers who enjoy riding motorcycles. Internationally, the club has over 20,000 members in more than 600 chapters, across 26 countries.

The local chapter includes active and retired members from all law enforcement agencies including: the Troup County Sheriff's Office, LaGrange Police, West Point Police, and the Georgia State Patrol, among others.
